Daniel Jones, CJF, has been shoeing horses in Fairhope, Ala., for 25 years. He attended Lookout Mountain Shoeing School in 1996. In 2008, Daniel was the WCB Striker of the Year and a WCB Top Ten Finisher in 2008 & 2009. He has competed on the American Farriers Team multiple times and served as the captain of the 2020

American Farriers Team. He is an AFA Certification Instructor and Examineer. Daniel received the 2018 Jim Linzy Outstanding Clinician Award and the 2019 Allen Smith Award for Execellence in Administration at the AFA National Convention. He received the Best Shod Foot Award at the International Shoeing Competition in Stoneleigh, England on day 2 in 2023. He is an excelletent clinician ansd individual and we so look forward to having him serve as our judge for this event.



Mr. Doug Russo is the Resident Farrier of the Iowa State University College of Veterinary Medicine, his role there includes teaching a two-week clinical rotation for 4th year vet students, Co-teaching a ½ semester lameness course and working in support of ISU's surgery team. Doug is a Past President of the Michigan Farrier's Association and has been exceptionally active and supportive of the Iowa Professional Farrier's Association. He is an active participant in several committees of the American



Each team member is responsible for a specimen shoe and a portion of the live shoeing (building shoes, striking, or floor work).

First 90 minutes your team will shoe the side of a draft horse with 3/4 Fullered toe clips front and hind

Shoe 1: 18 inches $\frac{1}{2}$ x 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ hind Ag. Heeled, $\frac{3}{4}$ fullered toe clip 8 nails E10

Shoe 2: 16 x ½ x 1 front plain stamped toe clip 7 nails E7

Shoe 3: 17 x ½ x 1 ¼ Double Dobber hind toe clip 7 nails E10

No more than two Open division competitors per team
